US ACCESS BOARD PROPOSED ACCESSIBILITY GUIDELINES FOR PEDESTRIAN FACILITIES

The Proposed Accessibility Guidelines for Pedestrian Facilities in the Public Right-of-Way (PROWAG) are currently recognized best practice for accessible design in the public right-of-way.

In this session, the guidelines for pedestrian access routes within sidewalks, shared use paths, curb ramps and street crossings will be presented.

This session will include a discussion of frequently asked PROWAG interpretation questions, and an update on the status of the rulemaking process.
