- The U.S. Access Board has produced animations on different requirements that are found in the ADA and ABA Standards and are an online guide to the standards. ## NEWS FROM DOJ AND THE CIVIL RIGHTS DIVISION

- Title II of the ADA Regulations ensures that discrimination against people with disabilities does not happen in public entities, including the criminal justice system. There is an obligation to provide reasonable modifications to policies, practices, and procedures, and an obligation to communicate effectively. The Department of Justice provides resources for public entities that includes technical assistance, enforcement activities in criminal justice settings, and other related resources.
